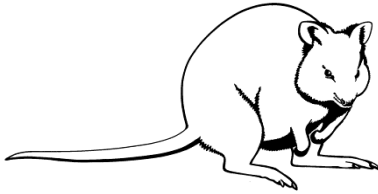
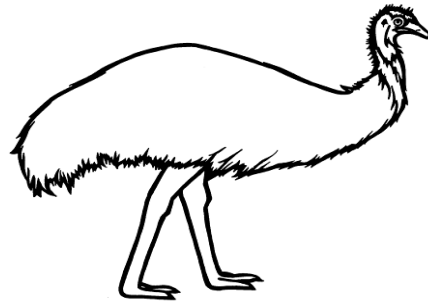

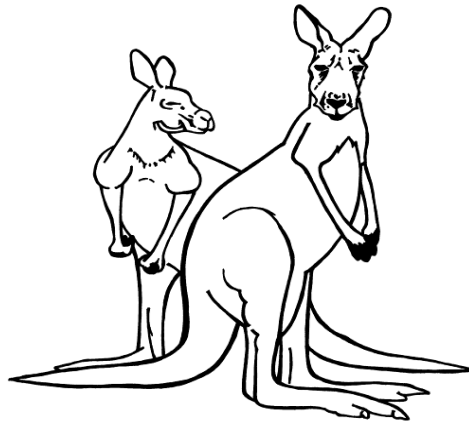

So I'm not a porcupine

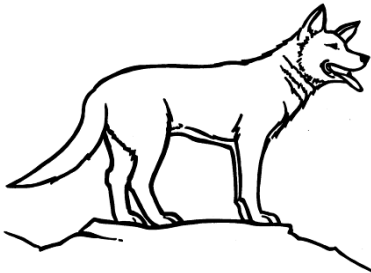
I'm a mammal that lays eggs

DID YOU KNOW?

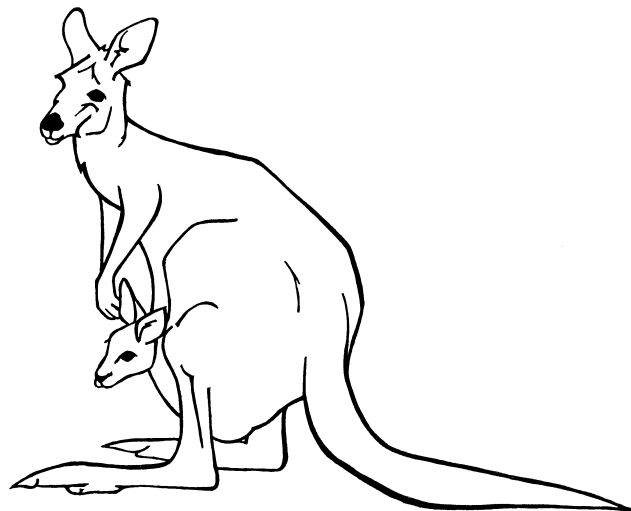
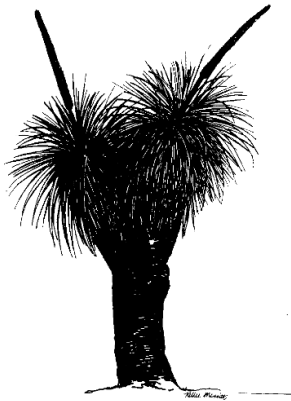
Female Shingleback Lizards give birth to live young, usually two at a time every summer.
