


Animal enCOUNTer: How many can you see?

I am an animal in the bushwalk That's covered with lots of spines I'm native to Australia So I'm not a porcupine


I'm a mammal that lays eggs But don't get in a muddle It's because I am a monotreme And my baby is called a puggle!












# **Shingle-back Skink**

Female Shingleback Lizards give birth to live young, usually two at a time every








# **Red Kangaroo**
