Friendly Frogs

Did you know that there are 16 frog species found in the south-west of Western Australia? How many frogs have you seen or heard near your house?

Almost one third of frog species around the world are threatened. Major threats include loss of habitat, pollution, disease and predators.

We can protect native frogs by keeping ponds and streams clean from pollution and finding ways to control introduced predators such as cats, dogs and foxes. You can help too - have you thought of making your garden frog-friendly? You could start by building a frog pond.

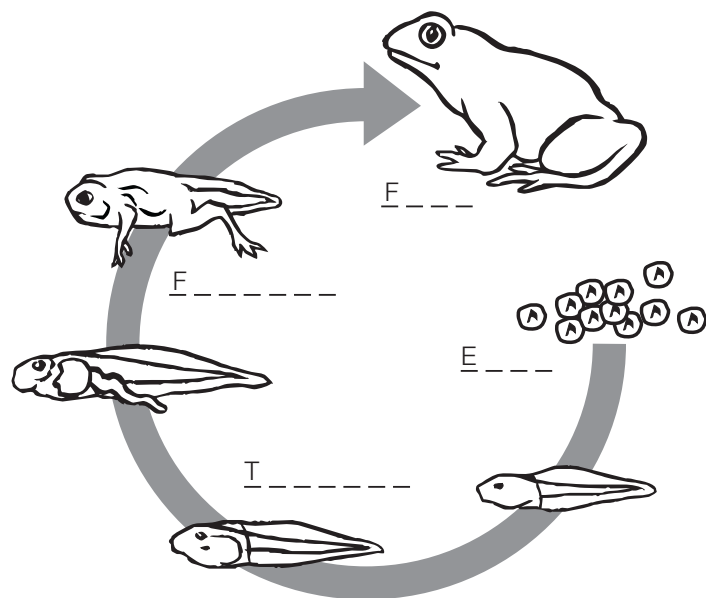
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Frog Life Cycle
