These three tigers have become a little mixed up and seem to have the covering of other animals. Can you work out which animals the other coverings belong to? Write the answers on the lines below the pictures.



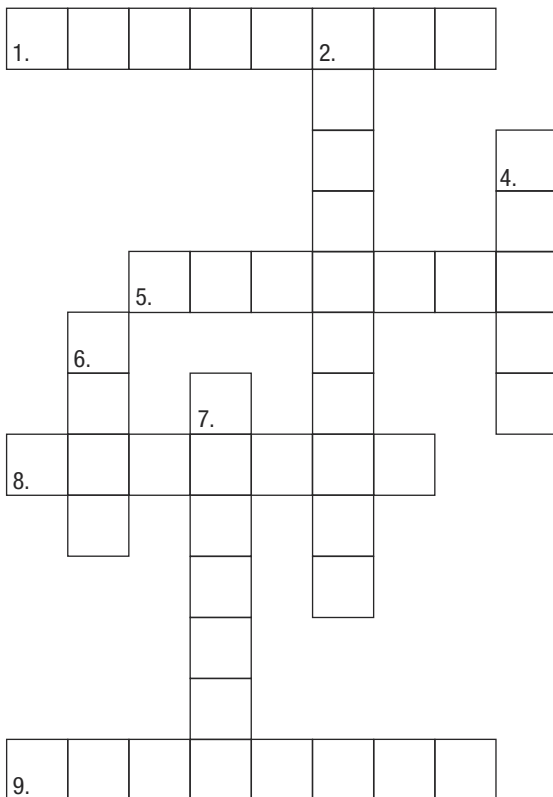
